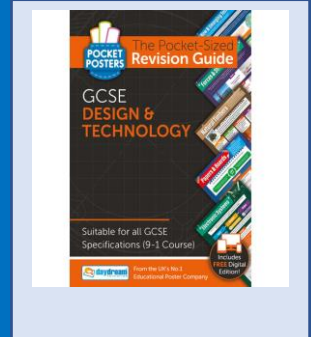
YEAR 1:
