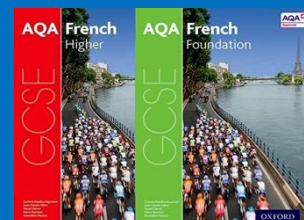

Learning a language is about communication, so learning French opens up doors in many industries. More than 300 million people speak French around the world. From international sports star, journalist or interpreter to lawyer, teacher, or translator; the world is your oyster when you speak another language.
