This course covers the following key topics:

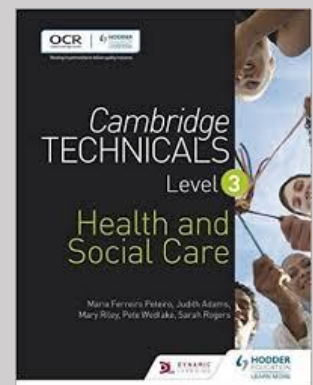
