Subject: Philosophy and Ethics – Edexcel

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The question we always get asked - What is it?!

Philosophy is **interdisciplinary**, which means it draws and develops its study from a variety of subjects – hence why philosophy is known as the <u>'root of all knowledge'.</u> If you want to blend psychology and sociology with science law, literature then this is the course for you. The course will develop your skills to **critically analyse** logic, **justify** different perspectives, and develop you to become an **independent thinker**.

What does the Edexcel course look like?

- 1) **Philosophy** This element of the course covers topics such as Arguments for the existence of God (Design, Cosmological, Ontological), the problem of evil and suffering, life after death and more!
- 2) Religion and Ethics –ethical theories such as situation ethics, utilitarianism, Natural Moral Law and looks at how they can be applied to various issues such as sexual, medical, and environmental ethics.
- 3) Study of a Religion This topic allows us to explore one religion in depth and we break the mould by studying Judaism. An exciting and diverse religion that enables us to explore issues such as the importance of women, the issue of Zionism, the impact of the holocaust and using it as a lens to discover different approaches to philosophical and Ethical issues.

We love teaching this course because we feel that it provides students with the skills needed to be a young philosopher as well as supporting them into university and beyond. The Edexcel A level course topics offer variety and We thrive on ability to explore, debate and discuss current issues within our A level such as abortion laws, explore long standing questions like 'Does God exist?' And provide insight into UK and world issues that may affect the future such as Zionism. We have a vibrant and specialist staff in the Philosophy and Ethics Department at CNS, all of whom are committed to sharing knowledge, engaging in discussion and teaching an A level that you will enjoy.
