General Feedback from Forms

Careers month feedback from Yr13— more creative careers please for June 2024 for the new Yr12s. Ms Nichols has made a note for next year and also reminded students of visits by the BBC, media groups and the NUA visits. Ms Nichols also talked about marketing the sessions more broadly so students think outside of the box.

Why is Yr13 parents' evening online? Some students would prefer face to face. Ms Nichols explained the 50:50 parental response to preferences last year and that meeting Yr12 parents and students was important for establishing the relationships early. If students feel a face to face is needed, they can book an appointment at the targeted evenings.




