Following the assemblies from Ms Philpott last week, you are well aware of what is expected, and we will start putting sanctions in place should these rules be ignored.

Study Hall

This is a silent study area and eating and drinking is not allowed other than water. If you wish to socialise or eat, please use the common room during lessons.

Gaming is not allowed in the study areas (including chess).

Elkins Centre

Ensure that the Elkins centre is kept clean and tidy -mess is not acceptable.

Chairs should not removed from their respective areas (plastic chairs belong in the café, padded chairs in the study centre) and should be put back after use.

Textbooks should be placed back onto the bookshelves after they have been used.

Food and litter should not be left on the floor – clean up after yourselves using the bins provided.

We all work in the Elkins centre and it's a beautiful new building, look after it please.

Smoking

Students must not smoke anywhere associated near the school. If you must smoke, please walk far down the road. PC Walford will ask you to move on if you are seen loitering.

Conduct around and outside of School



What are the UK Summer School programmes?

What is the new Access Apprenticeships programme?
