What future pathways might be open to me if I study French?

Learning a language is about communication, so learning French opens up doors in many industries. More than 300 million people speak French around the world. From international sports star, journalist or interpreter to lawyer, teacher, or translator; the world is your oyster when you speak another language. You could work as a character in Disneyland or volunteer or work with a charity like ‘Médecins sans Frontières’.

You could work in fashion design, modelling, make-up, film, publishing, marketing, law, or medicine. Learning French will help you in any career and people who speak another language are often better paid than their non-linguist colleagues.
