





# Curriculum at CNS 6<sup>th</sup> Form







- Breadth:
  - 33 different subjects;
  - The majority of students will study 3 A-Levels;
    - 12 hours curriculum time allocated to each subject per fortnight to explore beyond the confines of the curriculum;
    - 20 hours a fortnight of independent study time.
    - 1 hour of VESPA and Unifrog (Pathways)



# CNS: A Broad Curriculum



- 4 A-levels
  - Can start on 4
  - Must narrow down to 3 A-levels by end of 2<sup>nd</sup> week in Sept.
  - Students continuing with 4 A-levels must have an average GCSE grade of 7 and must maintain C or above in all semester exams.

# EPQ – Extended Project



- Half an A-Level
- Highly regarded by universities (more so than a 4<sup>th</sup> A-Level)
- Research focused: Dissertation or Artifact
- Allows you to develop independent study skills
- Specialised lessons and tutor support
- 4 hours per fortnight
- Special assembly in Sept
- Apply in Sept using the Microsoft forms

#### Core Maths



- AS = Half an A-Level
- Highly regarded by universities (more so than a 4<sup>th</sup> A-Level)
- Develops necessary maths skills needed in Sciences, psychology, economics, design technology, business
- Allows you to do 3 other A-levels plus AS
- Specialised lessons and tutor support with Maths specialist
- 3-4 hours per fortnight
- Apply in Sept using the Microsoft forms

# Entry Criteria - Ms Nichols

- Students wanting to study at CNS will need to achieve 5 grade 5s including English and Maths (min grade 4).
- In order to make a confident start to your A-Levels, we recommend that students achieve at least grade 6s in the subjects they wish to study.
- To study A-Level maths, students must achieve a grade 6.
- We also ask that students discuss their applications and grades with us.
