














12TJW: Where was your submission? I know Mr. Westwood was disappointed, come on folks!


The Music Production club on Friday lunchtime was a hit, managing to fill almost two computer rooms. For this reason, I need some help!



Geological Society of Norfolk: Lecture Programme for the 2024 -2025 Season

Our lectures are open to all. The level is not too technical and should be of interest to anyone wishing to learn more about geology and Earth Science. We particularly welcome younger visitors.

Lectures are generally held at 7.30 pm on the third Thursdays of the winter and spring months, in Room 0.01 on the ground floor of the New Science Building at the University of East Anglia. Two exceptions this year are the lecture on Tuesday February 20th 2025 which will form part of the Norwich Science Festival, and the lecture in April which will take place a week earlier than usual to avoid Easter. The programme for the coming season is as follows.

Thursday October 17th 2024: Dr Richard Herd, (University of East Anglia). - Paradise Lost - The eruption of a Caribbean volcano

Thursday November 21st 2024: Tim Holt-Wilson, (Geological Society of Norfolk). - Boxstones - In Search of Miocene Suffolk.

Tuesday February 18th 2025: Dr Colin Summerhayes, (Scott Polar Research Institute). - Climate Change, Geology, and the Future

Thursday March 20th 2025: Dr Richard Bevins, (Aberystwyth University). - The sources of the Stonehenge bluestones - applying modern analytical techniques

Thursday April 10th 2025: Dr Roy Livermore, (Open University) - Whatever Happened to Continental Drift? (And why 'plate tectonics' is such a bad name)
