
Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) – Edexcel Pearson

This course covers the following key topics:

The Extended Project (EPQ) is a **Level 3 stand-alone qualification equivalent to half an A Level.** The EPQ provides an opportunity to **independently** conduct an in-depth research project into a subject you are passionate about. You will study this alongside your A Levels across Yr12 and Yr13.



The EPQ helps in the development of many key skills such as independent learning, research, critical thinking and academic writing, which are valued by both employers and universities.
