## **CNS Home-School Agreement**

At CNS, we firmly believe that education is most successful when schools, parents, and students work together in close partnership. With this in mind, we ask you to read, sign and keep our updated Home-School Agreement, which is attached to this letter.

The Home-School Agreement sets out the shared expectations, responsibilities, and values that underpin our work together to help every child achieve 'Excellence in All.' It is not a contract, more a supportive tool that helps strengthen the partnership between school and home, to ensure that every student has the best chance of success. We expect that the terms of the agreement are maintained by school, parents, and students.

Why do we have a Home-School Agreement?

When schools, parents, and students commit to working in partnership, the benefits are far-reaching.

- Students benefit from:
  - o Higher attainment and achievement in their learning
  - o Better attendance and engagement
  - o Improved wellbeing and greater confidence
- Parents benefit from:
  - o Clearer and more open lines of communication with the school
  - Practical support in promoting learning at home
  - o Help in encouraging positive behaviour both in and out of school
- CNS benefits from:
  - A more engaged and involved school community
  - Stronger support in promoting positive behaviour and high standards
  - o Greater alignment between home and school in supporting each child's development

Achieving these outcomes is not always easy and requires commitment from everyone involved. The Home-School Agreement provides a shared understanding of our goals, responsibilities, and values, including respect, kindness, readiness to learn, and active participation.

By your child attending CNS you are showing your commitment to the Home School Agreement. Thank you for taking the time to read and discuss the Home-School Agreement with your child. If you have any questions or would like to discuss any part of it, please do not hesitate to contact the house team in first instance.

We look forward to continuing to work with you in partnership.

## CNS 4Ps Polite, Punctual, Prepared, Participation

Our 4 Ps have shaped our expectations at CNS for several years now and provide important lifelong and workplace qualities that we seek to develop in all our students. All students are expected and encouraged to abide by our four Learning Expectations: Punctual, Prepared, Polite, and Participation. These expectations are designed to make it possible for all students to learn in a calm and purposeful environment and develop the values and characteristics we strive to create as part of our CNS culture.

## <u>Punctual</u>

- Being in school is important to your child's academic achievement but it also has crucial impact on students' wellbeing, and wider development.
- Strong school attendance has a proven link to stronger educational outcomes.
- Students are expected to be on time to school and attend form time and to arrive at all their lessons on time.
- Students are expected to meet homework and coursework deadlines and catch up on work they have missed if being absent.

#### Prepared

- Part of being a successful learner is being a prepared learner. All students will have an equipment check in Form time at regular intervals throughout the year. We ask that all students come to school each day with the following:
  - A school bag big enough to carry exercise books and equipment to and from school safely which keeps them neat.
  - A pencil case with the following:
    - Blue or black pen
    - Pencil
    - Green pen
    - Whiteboard pen
    - Ruler
    - Rubber
    - Highlighter(s)
    - Optional items: sharpener, colouring pencils,
  - Maths will be asking for all students to have a calculator and recommend the following model:
    - Casio scientific calculator (FX-83GTX) or
    - Casio FX-83GT-CW
    - Maths equipment including.
    - Protractor
    - Compass
- Our mobile device policy remains unchanged. Mobile devices are not to be seen or heard in school unless being used for educational reasons or with permission of a member of staff. Devices will be confiscated, and parents will be asked to collect should a device be seen or heard.

#### Polite

- The way we speak to one another can make the difference to a person's day and the language used to ensure a positive environment for all.
- Be kind, considerate and respectful to all members of the CNS community, including visitors and neighbours.
- Ensure we treat the school building and learning environment with respect.

### Participation

- Students should take a proactive role in their learning by attempting all work, show determination and resilience when approaching the work set, and aspire to be the best that they can be.
- We want students to participate in wider school life through taking part in the range of opportunities on offer within our enrichment and co-curricular programme.

### Attendance

Your child is expected to attend school every day. Your child should only miss school in exceptional circumstances, for example, common colds or tiredness are not a reason for a day away from school. We will always seek to work in partnership with parents to understand any barriers to attendance and provide support to address these. #### Uniform

- A new school year allows a fresh start for uniform in line with the school policy which remains largely unchanged.
- The CNS uniform is affordable, practical, comfortable, and inclusive.
- Uniform will be checked daily by Form Tutors, and staff throughout the day. with sanctions for students not meeting expectations.
- Repeat or extreme failure to correct uniform infringements might result in students being out
  of circulation and parents will be contacted to support with correcting uniform infringements,
  as per the Home School Agreement.
- Please can you check your child's uniform to ensure it meets the school policy and if there are reasons for non-uniform clothing, please contact the House Teams to discuss how we can help.

## **Catering and Free School Meals**

In order to still offer a wholesome and nutritious hot and cold meal deal we have had to take the difficult decision to raise the price of the school meal deal to £2.85 due to rising costs from suppliers. Students eligible for Free School Meals will not be affected by this and can still use their Free School Meal allowance to purchase one of the hot or cold meal deals. The prices of other snack items will also rise in line with the cost of living.

It is important that anybody that may be entitled to Free School Meals claims their entitlement to ensure that they receive the support they need to thrive academically. #### Parking and cycling

We have seen an escalation in complaints from our neighbours about parental parking and conduct this year. A lock is also needed for bike security.
