Absence

It is the student's responsibility to email teachers to ask for work.

2025-26 The Holodomor - Foundation for the History of Totalitarianism

The Foundation for the History of Totalitarianism's essay writing competition this year is on the subject of Holodomor.

"In the case of the Holodomor, this was the first genocide that was methodically planned out and perpetrated by depriving the very people who were producers of food of their nourishment (for survival). What is especially horrific is that the withholding of food was used as a weapon of genocide and that it was done in a region of the world known as the 'breadbasket of Europe'." – **Prof. Andrea Graziosi, University of Naples.**

First prize: £1,500, Second prize: £700, Third prize: £500!

The deadline for entries is 25th January 2026.

Cambridge Higher Aspirations Scheme (CHAS) – Gonville and Caius

Please note – this is entirely different to the Higher Aspirations Scheme you signed up for during your first weeks.

We are writing to invite Year 12 students to apply for the Cambridge Higher Aspirations Scheme (CHAS) 2025/26. Now in its sixth year, CHAS is an innovative outreach programme aimed at encouraging bright and ambitious students to set their sights on top universities, as well as providing a sustained academic programme of support and guidance throughout their time in sixth form/college.

Sessions involve 5 supervisions (Cambridge style small group teaching) led by a researcher from the University, and there is an additional 1 night residential in Cambridge that can be applied for.


